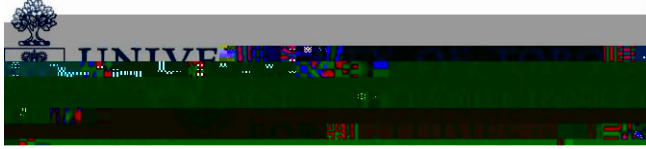
WHAT IS PERSONAL INFORMATION?

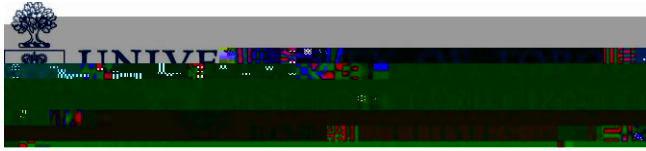
Personal information is information that relates to an individual. Personal information includes information that relates to: an individual's name, address and telephone number).

Business information is not protected by privacy legislation.

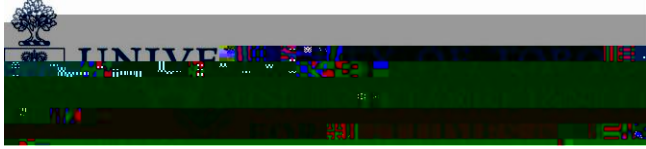
WHO WE ARE

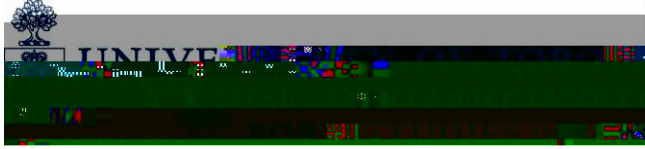
